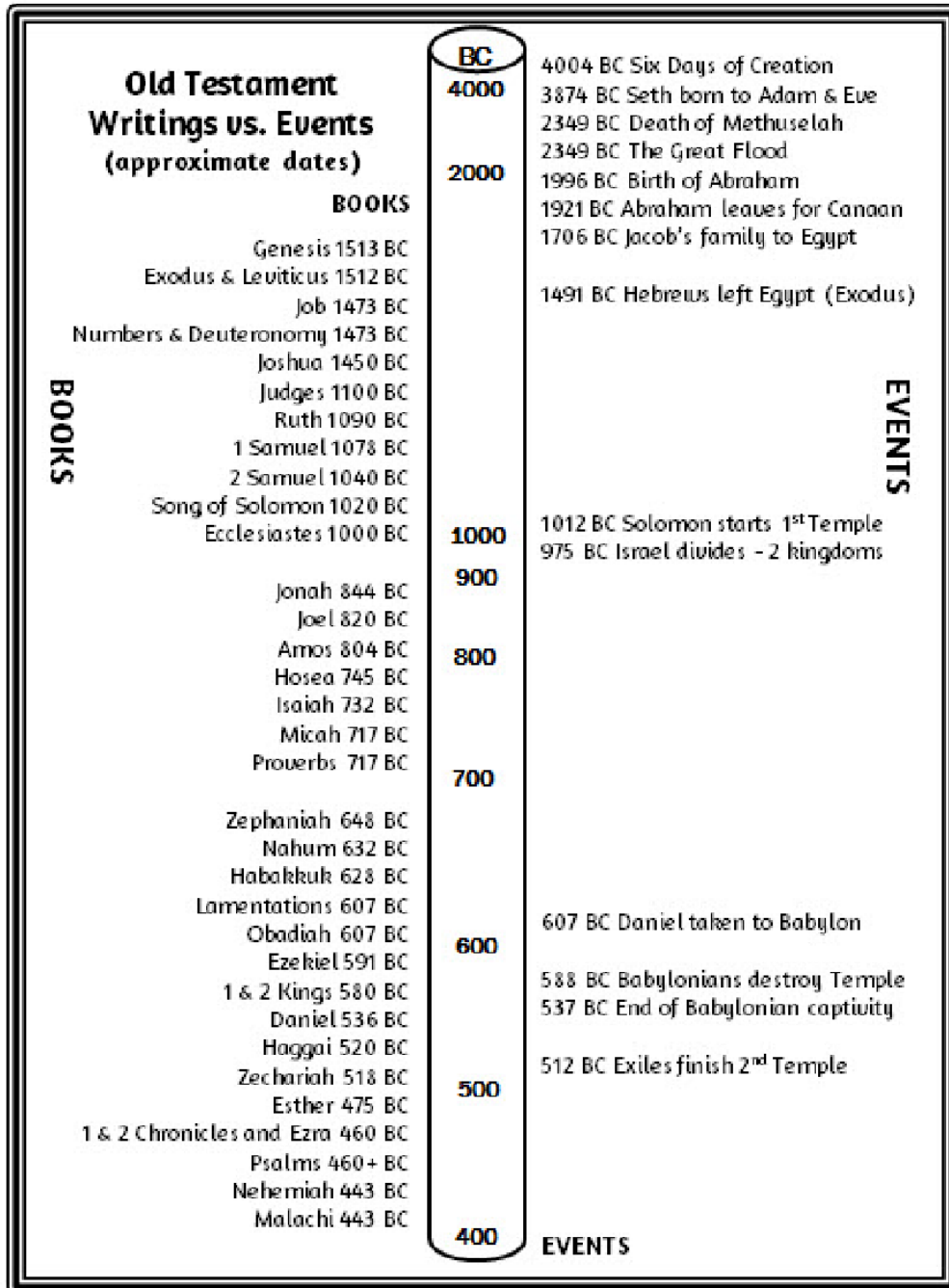

Controversial Mormon Doctrine
